A Cross-Indexed Bibliography of
Seventeenth-Century American Imprints
Pertaining to American Indians

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INTRODUCTION

A MORE extensive utilization of the *Early American Imprints, 1639-1800*, edited by Clifford K. Shipton of the American Antiquarian Society and published by Readex Microprint Corporation, has in the past been handicapped by a paucity of bibliographical guides to this massive collection. Clifford K. Shipton and James E. Mooney's *National Index of American Imprints Through 1800: The Short-Title Evans*, 2 vols. ([Worcester], American Antiquarian Society and Barre Publishers, 1969) constitutes the primary guide to the material, arranged alphabetically as it is. Further needs can be filled to a degree by the preparation of a series of bibliographies which provide the researcher with a listing of collection entries pertaining to a limited subject area. The present work is such a topical bibliography. It lists every known seventeenth-century book, pamphlet, and broadside, published in America, found to pertain to Native Americans. This bibliography, covering the limited period 1639-1700, stands as the first part of a work which, when completed, will encompass the entire period, 1639-1800, covered by the *Imprints*, First Series.

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Method

The method used in compilation of the bibliography consisted of three major stages. The first of these, a screening-out process, was guided by the title and descriptive statements given in Charles Evans's *American Bibliography* (13 vols., Chicago: privately printed and Worcester: American Antiquarian Society, 1903-55), in Shipton-Mooney, and in Roger P. Bristol's *Supplement to Charles Evans' American Bibliography* (Charlottesville: University Press of Virginia, 1970). Those items which could safely be excluded from further consideration by virtue of their subject matter were eliminated at this point. As the titles and descriptions of each Evans or Bristol-Evans entry was read, careful attention was paid to its subject matter. Religious tracts, philosophical dissertations, and sermons, unless directed to or concerning Native Americans, were omitted. Those entries such as sermons preached to militia units or governmental officials, which were considered of questionable relevance, were not excluded during this stage.

The second stage consisted of a screening-in process. Any entry, which had escaped exclusion by the first screening, was then judged against a set of criteria any one of which would gain for the work inclusion in the bibliography. The items which survived this screening constituted the substance of the inventory. The set of criteria included: tribal names, Native American individuals' names, and generic terms such as 'Indian.' In those entries where such vague generic terms as 'heathen' were found, a careful scrutiny of content was made to establish that the references were indeed to Native Americans. This second stage involved a page-by-page search through the individual imprints for any one of the three ethnological criteria. John R. Swanton's *The Indian Tribes of North America* (Washington: Government Printing Office, 1952) was of great aid in identifying the tribal names in their variant spellings and designations. All Evans entries for which no copies have survived or for which no originals ever existed

(the 'ghosts') were eliminated from the bibliography during this stage.

The third stage was a process of identifying tribal and place-names. The substance of the bibliography having been established by the first two stages, the cross-indexing of these constituted the final process. Aided by Swanton's *Indian Tribes* and *Webster's Geographical Dictionary* (rev. ed., Springfield, Mass.: Merriam, 1969), a second page-by-page search through the individual imprints was made. Close attention was paid to tribal and individual names, and to place-names whether of Native American or colonial origin. Since the second section of the bibliography's format was to be ethnological in nature and the third section geographical, determination had to be made as to the suitability of entries under one or both of the sections. Tribal and individual names aided in the indexing of items under the ethnological section of the bibliography. Native American and colonial place-names aided in the indexing of entries under the geographical section. As the use of Native American place-names often continued long after the removal of Native Americans from specific areas, care was taken to establish textual connections between Native Americans and these Native American place-names. Care was also taken to discern connections between Native Americans and the colonial place-names used to form the geographical section.

Format

The format of the bibliography is characterized by the division of the work into three sections. The first of these consists of a direct listing of all entries, arranged chronologically. The second is an ethnological index, arranged by the names of Native American tribes. The third comprises a geographical index, arranged by states, with boundaries as constituted today.

Section I lists numerically all entries by their number in the Readex series. The citations used in the bibliography follow the 'short-title' form found in Shipton and Mooney, omitting only the copy locations. Researchers seeking the location of copies are directed, however, to the volumes of Evans and Bristol. The phrase, 'See pp.,' which follows each short-title citation directs the researcher to those pages within each entry in which references to Native Americans occur.

Within Section II, each tribal name is entered alphabetically according to the form and spelling found in Swanton. Following the tribal names are the names of component tribes which formed the larger tribes. All entries listed under a tribal name must have contained textual reference to that tribe by name. Items mentioning Native American individuals, who could be identified as members of a specific tribe, were entered under that tribe's name. Under each tribal heading, all items are listed numerically.

Within Section III, each state name is entered alphabetically. All entries listed under a state name must have contained geographical references by name to that state or to locations within its boundaries. To avoid difficulties created by changes in colonial jurisdictions, present state boundaries are used throughout this section. The items are entered in numerical order with copy locations omitted as in Section I of the bibliography.

Those page numbers, within all three sections, which are bracketed may cause the researcher some confusion as they refer to imprint pages which carry no page numbers. The editor has used the straightforward method of bypassing missing or blank pages in the imprints in ascribing these page numbers. Yet, with due care the reader should encounter no serious difficulties as the pages involved are in most cases few in number.
